Trash is picked up on Monday and if left for an entire week is very unsightly.

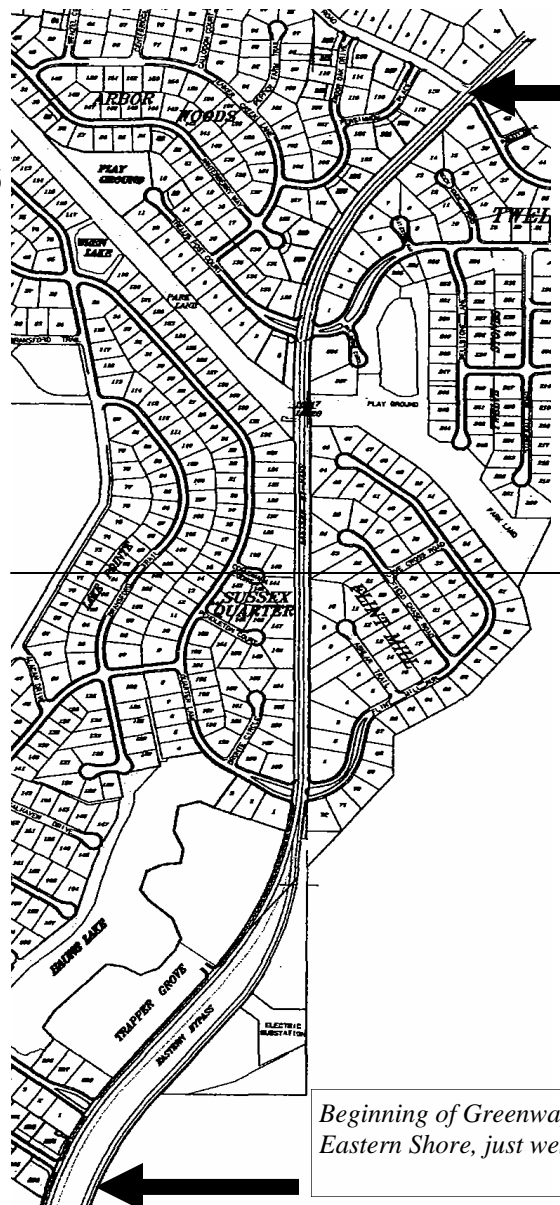
Please maintain community standards and keep trash items in the garage until Sunday evening.
