Twelve Stones/Cobblestone Farms

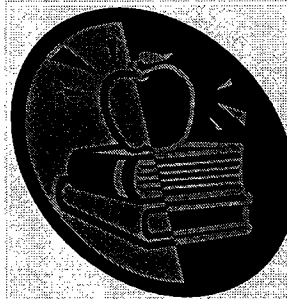

Mr. Tucker will be attempting to organize community watches so email him or check the Hampton Cove Website Bulletin Board for information. He can provide a list of guidelines to review with your family.

Here are some good practices to employ in your neighborhood:

1. Pay attention to who is in the area when you go to and from work.
2. Be alert from vehicles cruising the neighborhood when you are tending your gardens, or when taking children to and from school. (This is especially important because of all the construction traffic transiting our neighborhood.)
3. Know your neighbor's routine and their vehicles so you can spot something out of the ordinary.
4. Call your neighbor if you see or hear something suspicious. If you are still concerned call the non-emergency police number at 722-1700 or if there is an emergency call 911.
5. Finally, be aware of what goes on around you so you can provide information to law enforcement.

Covenant Corner

Article V, Section 2.

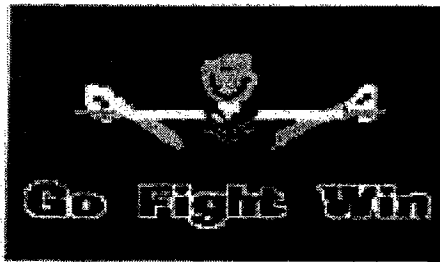
Owner's Maintenance Responsibility. Each Owner shall maintain or cause to be maintained in a safe, clean and attractive condition all property subject to this Declaration which is owned directly or indirectly by such owner in a manner consistent with the Community-Wide Standard and this Declaration. Such maintenance obligation shall include, without limitation, the following: Prompt removal of all litter, trash, refuse, and waste; lawn mowing on a regular basis; tree and shrub pruning; watering landscaped areas; keeping improvements, exterior lighting, and maintenance facilities in good repair and working order; keeping lawn and garden areas alive, free of weeds, and attractive; keeping driveways in good repair; complying with all governmental health and police requirements; repair of exterior damages to improvements; and, if applicable, striping of parking areas and keeping roads and parking areas in good repair.

Partial Maintenance Check List:

- Does the roof, overhang, or siding need cleaning?
- Are elements of the landscaping overgrown and in need of replacement?
- Is the back of your wooden fence (or that of your neighbor) in need of a fresh coat of paint or stain? (Kindly mention it to your neighbor, most people don't see the back of their fence)
- Are the power sources easily accessible by utility worker?
- Are people on the sidewalk walking into (or having to walk around) poorly maintained tree limbs?

Five Layer Bars

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 1 cup butterscotch morsels
- 1 cup shredded coconut
- 1 cup semisweet chocolate morsels
- 1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, melted
- 1 (14-ounce) can sweetened condensed milk

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

Combine graham cracker crumbs and melted butter. Press into bottom of a 9 by 13-inch baking dish.

Layer first 4 ingredients over crumb mixture. Pour sweetened condensed milk over the layers. Bake for 30 minutes. Allow to cool and cut into bars.

As an Easter gift:

The first five ingredients can be layered in a decorative jar. Layer pecans, butterscotch morsels, coconut, and chocolate morsels. Spoon Graham cracker crumbs into a small plastic or cellophane bag and place on top of layers. Give to your friends with the above directions.
